Goals and Details

Our goal: to acquire adequate funding from grants and private donations to maintain the North Shore Nordic skiing trail locations each winter season.

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Needs: For the current 2012-2013 season, **\$14,000** is needed to fund our grooming operations.

Trails: High-quality nordic skating lane and classic (diagonal) technique tracks laid for the entire length of the trail system at each of three nordic areas in the South Flathead Valley.

Season: Grooming starts with the first available snowpack above 4 or 5 inches (typically the 1st or 2nd week of December).

Snow: Most trails exist in location with above-average snowfall for areas of similar elevation in the Flathead Valley.

The Benefits

■ Provide the residents, families and local schools in the Flathead Valley (and particularly in the Lakeside/Somers/Bigfork areas) with a *local* alternative for winter activities.

■ Increase tourism and recreational opportunities on the North Shore of Flathead Lake during what is traditionally the area's slowest visitor season.

Enhance opportunities to establish winter recreation and educational activities for youth and school programs.

Establish quality Nordic sites to foster new—and revive old—interest in outdoor winter activities.
